\*\* Higher rate of funding may apply if work is completed by landowner (i.e. fencing, tree planting etc.)

<sup>#</sup> Repair or replacement of an existing private septic system which has failed. This does not include septic systems that are installed in conjunction with the construction of a new dwelling or upgrades to facilitate household expansion including the addition of bathrooms or devices that increase wastewater volume (eg. dishwasher).
